Swachhta Pakhwada - Report

With reference to Action Plan of Swachhta Pakhwada received from Regional Director, Regional Directorate of NSS, Swachhta Pakhwada was observed from 1st August to 15th August, 2018, by the NSS units of the College with its spirit and devotion.

The drive was successful because of the active and committed participation of the NSS volunteers under the efficient leadership of Ms.Uma Roy and Ms.Rohini Yadav from NSS-IPCW and the wilful support of the college authorities. A total number of 44 NSS volunteers from the second and third year participated in the Swachhta Pakhwada from 1st August to 15th August, 2018. The participants were so involved that the participation in the events throughout the period was 159, and it is more than three times that of the number of volunteers.

The drive began with the Swachhata Shapath. It was followed by door-to-door campaigns, awareness regarding cleanliness, female hygiene, sanitation and waste management. A visit was also made to Defence colony slum in Vidhan Sabha and Meena Devi Jindal Hospital. Our volunteers also had an interactive session with children regarding cleanliness. Apart from this, sweeping & garbage collection drive was undertaken inside and strategic locations outside the college.

On 14th August 2018, a rally was conducted to raise awareness regarding cleanliness in the college.

The day-wise events undertaken by NSS-IPCW with the pictures are enclosed here with the report.

DAY 1: SWACHHTA SHAPATH



On the first day, Swachhta Shapath was taken in the presence of Programme Officer. There were more than fifty participants who took the oath on that day.

DAY 2: CLEANING INSIDE THE COLLEGE



On 2nd day, the cleanliness drive was initiated from the NSS room by cleaning the areas in and around the room by ten volunteers, spending an hour.

DAY 3: CLEANING INSIDE THE COLLEGE



On 3rd day, **six** volunteers were involved in cleaning and collecting garbage around the canteen area for **an hour**.

DAY 4: CLEANING INSIDE THE COLLEGE

On 6th day, **seven** volunteers visited Defence colony slum in Vidhan Sabha. They engaged in a door to door campaign for **two hours**, where they raised awareness regarding open defecation. It was an interactive session with the community. Most of them were construction workers.

DAY 8: SWEEPING THE GARAGE DISPOSAL IN THE ADOPTED SLUM



On 8th day, for around **two hours**, **twelve** volunteers were engaged in sweeping and garbage disposal in the adopted slum in Defence Colony near Vidhan Sabha.

DAY 9: MOVIE SCREENING AND INTERACTIVE TALK SESSION WITH CHILDREN REGARDING CLEANLINESS



On 9th day, around **twelve** volunteers went to Defence colony and was involved with the young minds for **two hours**. The children were made aware of the benefits of cleanliness with the help of videos and movies. A group discussion was also organized among the children. It helped them to learn about hygiene and cleanliness.

DAY 10 & 11: CLEANING PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS



On 10th and 11th day, about **fourteen** volunteers spent around **an hour** cleaning and sweeping the area around the Civil Lines Metro station and Bus Stop.



DAY 13: INTERACTIVE TALK SESSION REGARDING CLEANLINESS



On 13th day, about **eleven** volunteers visited Meena Devi Jindal Hospital and interacted with the people for **an hour** and created awareness about the cleanliness.

DAY 14: SWACHHATA RALLY



On 14th day, a rally was organized inside College premises with a participation of **twenty** volunteers for **an hour**. The volunteers rose slogans regarding cleanliness and hygiene.
